30th March 2023 Coordinator Report

Easton Neighborhood watch Scheme is now locally approved, and we are also now part of the recently formed Huntingdonshire neighborhood watch association. This was set up to share information and good practice.

An Easton Village – Neighbourhood Watch Email address has been created, and circulated to residents, with necessary alerts going out to residents.



Incidents & Crimes reported occurring in Easton.

Easton continues to be a safe village to live in, there have however been five incidents, some, but not all logged with the Police, some appear to be transient, with people passing through the village.

- March 22- Burglary in Chapel Lane- case closed no suspects identified.
- July 22 – violence/sexual offence – near Broadweir case closed unable to prosecute suspect.
- December 22- reports of Anti-social behavior near to Broadweir.
- Un-reported. Theft of a portable toilet.
- Insulation scam, several residents were contacted by a company called Eco Homes, wanting to check the loft insulation and ensure that it was safe, so a safety certificate could be issued. The number used had been flagged as an Insulation scam, active previously in the Sheffield, Leeds and Manchester areas, it has been associated with another company called Eco-Systems and another name of Ben Collins. Email alert sent out and incident flagged to Action Fraud.

Miscellaneous

I continue to receive E-cops- alerts and will vet and send out relevant alerts to residents.

Some Neighbourhood Watch street signs and window stickers have arrived, to be circulated and fitted to Council maintained posts.
