This has been the best season ever for pears, damsons and cherry plums in my garden, and there have been loads of blackberries since August. While picking some a month ago with my grand-daughter Louise, I spotted a Large Tortoiseshell caterpillar in its nettle-leaf tent and gave it to her to take home. She phoned a week ago with the message: "I let the butterfly out – today. Phone back – soon." Full marks for feeding it with nettles from her garden through to pupation and emergence! Following last month's query, I'm glad to say that Hedgehogs are doing well in Easton with reports from Chapel Lane (a pair), the Weir and Church Road – at least four individuals, unless one or two are exceptionally nippy! A few Kestrels have also reappeared as successful broods from somewhere have spread out to exploit vacant territories. Gwen Tomline and Val Ellis have seen an unusual small yellow finch on their bird feeders, possibly a Serin or an escaped Canary. All sort of rare birds are seen at Grafham Water from time to time but Cheti's Warblers are a new record this year, I believe. Their chattering call is distinctive, luckily, as you will rarely see one as it skulks in the reeds. Dormice, too, have had a good year in Brampton Wood, I hear. There is going to be a "Gnawed Nut Hunt" in October to determine their spread in the wood – all eyes welcome!
