## NATURE NOTES 24

With our ponds well topped up again now, here's hop(p)ing for a productive future! Thank you, Val. Lest anyone should think Richard Burton had been imbibing unduly when he saw his puma last December, my British Wild Life journal for December mentions an Oxfordshire wood where pumas are known to be breeding. Evidence is solid – sightings, scratch marks, a plaster cast of a paw print and "a dead Muntjac 23 feet up a tree!" On the other hand, I'm afraid I must unpeel the Orange Peel fungus I reported from Shepherds Close as they are apparently just an unusual form of the

Scarlet Elfcup – identified by its spores under a microscope by Sheila Wells. March has continued some early records with our first migrant warbler, a Chiff-chaff, heard on 9<sup>th</sup> March (24<sup>th</sup> March in 2005), my first Brimstone butterfly seen on 11<sup>th</sup> March (14<sup>th</sup> April in 2006) and first hovering Bee-fly on the 27<sup>th</sup> (April 17<sup>th</sup> in 2006). A colony of Buff-tailed bumblebees was busy on the 13<sup>th</sup> collecting pollen from willow catkins in my orchard while honey-bees were at the cherry-plum blossom. *Bombus terrestris* is one of the largest and most common species of bumble bee. Its nests are underground and may have more than 300 workers. Look out now for *lapidarius*, which is all black except for a red tail.
