
The sights and sounds of Summer are all around us and, as Clive Wood likes to remind us, the days are getting shorter now! I have been away much of May and June so these three pictures were not taken locally – though they all could have been. The first is of a blue tit feeding young at its nest in a brick wall no more than ten feet from where I stood. A cat crept under the gate into this little courtyard, attracted by the continuous cheeping of the chicks, but was shooed out and the chicks fledged successfully. Flycatchers have, unfortunately, not nested in our garden or in the Silcocks' garden this year, but there are a pair at the Nixons. The British Trust for Ornithology

are continuing their research into Flycatcher migration this year and have managed to put geolocators on some ten birds in Cambridgeshire so far, but not from Easton.



The second picture is of a pair of damsel-flies in tandem; the male grasps the female at the back of the head during mating and suspends her above the water to lay her eggs - strange to think that

something like this dance may have been enacted every year for three hundred million years, since the Carboniferous period. We get three or four kinds of dragonflies and damsel flies in the Easton Brook. The third picture is of a Hummingbird Hawk moth, which the camera has managed to catch in mid-flight so that one can actually see the veins in the wings, the antennae and the proboscis like a watch-spring with which it sups nectar while hovering. We almost always get one or two in Easton every year as they are strong migrants from France and Spain; they especially love Red Valerian flowers.
