I saw this lovely little Wasp beetle, *Clytus arietis*, in our porch last year. Like many hoverflies, it mimics a wasp not just in appearance but in its jerky movements, which are no doubt part of its protection from predators, for it is really quite harmless and I was happy to let it run over my finger. The larvae live in dead wood, of which we had quite a lot – until recently, when the latest gale blew down three dead elms along our boundary. Dead wood is host to a legion of specialist insects from the little Elm bark beetle, which is the vector for Dutch elm disease, to the Giant woodwasp, which resembles a hornet with a huge ovipositor that looks like a sting. Such insects are, of course, important for woodpeckers, of which we have a resident

pair. The second beetle is a Cockchafer, sometimes called a Maybug or Doodlebug, which came to a light trap set up for moths in our garden. These used to be common in the past, when they often flew around lights at night and sometimes in through an open window. The larvae of these live in the soil, feeding on roots for three years before becoming adult, but they have become quite scarce since the ploughing up of much of the grassland in Easton and conversion to arable land in the 1960s. We hear so much these days of the decline of insects generally, that I feel one needs to record such interesting species. And what of the things that feed on them? Anyone seen a hedgehog, or a toad or a frog?
