### NATURE NOTES 120

Where are the songs of Spring? Well, of course, we have been hearing the ‘song-twice-over’ Thrush for several weeks, but the first Chiff-chaff Warbler arrived in our garden on 30<sup>th</sup> March, followed by a Blackcap on 4<sup>th</sup> April. Isn’t it fascinating how regular these two heralds of spring are, despite the vagaries of weather and the gauntlets of migration? In the previous two years they were first heard on 30<sup>th</sup> March and 8<sup>th</sup> April, and on 1<sup>st</sup> April and 11<sup>th</sup> April respectively. The song I really want to hear is the gentle purring of the Turtle dove, pictured here in a special British Trust for Ornithology bulletin. It is a

few years since I heard them in Easton village but probably the best chance will be around Lodge Farm and Savages Spinney where I have heard them more recently, as they like tall hedgerows. This lovely bird has declined by 95% in the past 25 years and the BTO is conducting a special survey between May and September this year, so please report any sightings or hearings. The BTO has concluded its special study of Spotted flycatchers, but Michael Holdsworth is continuing his interest, and I have published a little article entitled A Flycatcher Diary, bringing together all my diary records for Easton over the past 20 years (which I could print out for anyone interested). Their first appearance in our garden has ranged from 11<sup>th</sup> May to 8<sup>th</sup> July, but those arriving after mid-June were probably starting a second brood, and the median date for starting a first brood comes at 30<sup>th</sup> May.
