FARMER BURTON'S COUNTRY TALK



When I last wrote I still had one field which I hadn't sown with Winter Wheat because the weather broke in November and the field was too wet to continue. I did consider drilling it in one of the hard frosts we had in mid-December but decided to wait and was really pleased I did when we had such a prolonged dry spell allowing me to set my Winter

Wheat in early February. It went in the soil lovely but I had to put it on a lot thicker because the local crows and pigeons will always find it and start pecking up the seeds.

February used to be cold and wet, a month when farm machinery is serviced, workshop tidied and paper work caught up in the farm office. But over the last few years they seem to be getting drier and I applied some Nitrogen fertiliser to the wheats to get them growing after the Winter cold. I don't like to waste any because Nitrogen is now double the price that it was before the war in Ukraine. You may also have seen me in the village cutting the hedges so that the hedges keep 'tight' and stockproof. I try to all this done before the songbirds start to nest.

While working this week James and I saw a Chinese Water Deer on our land, a species which we had never seen before on the farm. So now we have Chinese, Muntjac and Roe. We saw a herd of 7 Roe(see pic above)up the hill near Stonely Road while feeding the pheasants about a month ago which was fantastic to see.

The lack of rain is a worry and Grafham Water is still struggling to fill up. I bought a 15,000-litre water tank to collect the water from my farm shed roof

and it never filled up over the Winter, I intend to use this water for spraying pesticides on my crops. The long-term weather is still talking about the possibility of cold weather for March but let's hope it won't be another 'Beast from the East'!

Food security in the UK has been hitting the news lately with supermarkets struggling to fill shelves with veg. I hope you will all try to buy British and seasonal food.

Time to get walking again!
