Easton United Charities – a new Trustee required

Easton United Charities has existed as a combination of 3 charities since 1972. Before that date there were 3 charities, one of which dates back to 1879. In 1972, under the approval of the Charity Commission those 3 charities were joined to form the Easton United Charities (EUC). The charities were established to provide financial help for the poor and needy in the parish of Easton. This remains the primary objective of the EUC, although the EUC's activities have expanded somewhat in recent years, with Charity Commission approval, to include grants to children and young people at certain points during their formal scholarly education, and to provide grants for residents of Easton during hospital stays or at other times of need. The main assets of the charity are land donated in the past. Rent from the lease of this land provides an income in support of the grants. There are 5 trustees appointed to administer the charity, 2 are nominated by the Parish Council for a period of 4 years and 3 trustees are co-opted for a period of 5 years. One of those co-optative trustees has recently left the village and thereby

resigned. We are now looking to fill that vacant position. The EUC ordinarily meets only 3 times per year, although an annual field walk and extraordinary meetings will be required at certain times during the year. If you would like to offer your services to the EUC, or learn more about the position, please contact either the Chairman: Mrs Kathy Yates (ivan_kathy@hotmail.com) or the Secretary: Mr Phil Bell (japer.bell@btinternet.com) to express your interest. Please include a brief statement of how you believe that you could contribute to the village through the management of the EUC. We appreciate that this is holiday time, but our next meeting is scheduled for the second week in August and it would be helpful to receive any emails of interest or application by 5th August 2025.
