Farmer Burton's Country Talk



The UK harvest of 2025 was off to an early start with some areas seeing Barley Winter being combined late June in some areas, due to dving off in the dry Spring and high temperatures. Oilseed Rape yields are reported to be good while Wheat yields are mixed, depending on if it had rain, with grain quality being

high in terms of specific weight and protein content. Specific weight partly depends on grain size along with grain density and high protein is needed for milling, for example. This has been the earliest harvest since 2006.

We started our harvest on Wednesday 16th July, a good couple of weeks earlier than expected. We combined that day and the next day until we were hit by a storm later that afternoon. We recorded 7mm but were very lucky because there were some really bad storms going round us! On Friday it was very hot and humid, so we kept checking the Wheat all day for dryness until it was finally fit to harvest at 6pm. The grain moisture ideally needs to be under 14.5% so that it can be stored in the barn without it going mouldy. We finished that field at Midnight, which is at the top of the hill, on the left, just before the Railway Bridge. Then Saturday brought heavy storms and thunder, along with 27mm, so 'rain stopped play' for a few more days. As I write this, I'm hoping to get the Wheat finished in the next couple of days and then it will be straight into the Spring Barley, that also ready to harvest. Our Wheat hasn't yielded too badly

but the grains are quite small because of the lack of rain, as they haven't 'plumped up', but as long as I get it in the store, dryish, I'll be happy!

It's a lovely feeling when you finally climb into the combine and start to harvest the crop that you have been looking after for the previous 9 months and see if your hard work has paid off!

Our Claas combine has a 17ft cutting knife which is small compared to many. The largest in the UK is 45ft which would be no good for me, as I wouldn't be able to fit it through any of my gateways!

This week a Senior Executive at M&S has criticised planned changes to Farm Inheritance Tax, warning that it will put off young people working in farming. He said that it is very clear that Agriculture should be treated differently by the Government (and this is just not any store!).

A big plea to all drivers in the countryside, over the next few weeks, to take your time and be patient if you get behind a tractor/grain trailer who are only trying to do their job and put food on your table, THANK YOU.
